COMMUNITY CHAMPIONS

Gratitude, paying it forward, counting one’s blessings are acts of recognition that occur when we take stock of our good fortune. In some families teaching children that they have a responsibility to “give back” begins very early, as was the belief of the Heffner family from the time they arrived here from Hungary in 1957. Canada has been the refuge for those escaping from war, from political instability, from desperation, it has been the country to embrace those who have needed to find a new home. Settling into the Kitchener community with a home on Otto Street, where Centre in the Square now resides, Mary and Joh Heffner instilled in their children a deep appreciation for the support this community gave them as they established a new life, and as they built Heffner Toyota. It was always with the belief that this commitment would be returned to our community through their Community Investment Program which proudly supports well over 200 services in this Region.

As I spoke with John and Willy Heffner I was struck by the compassion which seemed to be their cornerstone, a caring for the folks who needed a hand up. They fund a scholarship for young people in Automotive Programs, most recently they have started a Cabinet Makers program to train people in the fine art of woodworking, they host Morning Glory Café to

provide disenfranchised youth with opportunities in food services. It is rare to find people who are not only committed to providing a business built on such a strong ethical base but who also look for opportunities to share their success with as many others as they can through their support of community initiatives.

John and Willy Heffner, and the Heffner family, are helping SHOW realize the dream to house nine more individuals in our community through a very generous donation to our build at 402 Erb Street West and our gratitude to this remarkable family is immeasurable. A MAN OF SKILL AND COMMITMENT...

People who are homeless often lack access to basic health care, and it is not unusual when someone is housed at SHOW to move in with often very compromised health, both physical and mental. We work to connect



our tenants with health care services to address the myriad of health concerns that come from living in poverty with little access to adequate nutrition, housing or medical supports. Addictions to dull the reality of homelessness or as a way of self medicating can take a huge toll on physical well

being. Premature aging often results from life on the street, untreated health needs can become life and death situations for some.

A short while ago a new IDA pharmacy opened on Erb Street West, owned by a man we at SHOW have all come to know. Mairaj Naveed spent years working in our community before opening his own pharmacy and we are very lucky to have him. He provides our tenants with excellent support, and treats each and every one of them with respect, with dignity and with great care, recognizing that he is a partner in our work to improve the health and lives of our tenants, and of the larger community. SHOW and Waterloo have benefited from Mairaj's skill as a pharmacist, but more importantly to us, as a kind, gentle and very compassionate human being deeply committed to this Region.

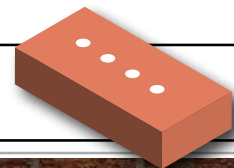
